Packing List

Please check to make sure you have received all the items below before starting to brew.

2. Fermenter Lid Z97
5. Priming Tank E13
6. Hydrometer T07
7. Hydrometer Jar T05
8. Thermometer T65
9. Home Beermaking B10
10. 18" Stirring Spoon E46
11. Brewers Edge Cleanser A26
12. Bottle Brush E15 or Z80 (may vary)
13. Emily Capper EA2
14. 150 Bottle Caps E19

Electric Kettle Tip

If you ordered a Mash & Boil or Digiboil as your optional boiling pot, be sure to turn off the heat just before you mix in the malt extract. As soon as the extract is dissolved, turn the heat back on and continue. This prevents burned malt and error codes.

Getting Started

We recommend that you read Home Beermaking by William Moore before starting, to familiarize yourself with the basic brewing process. Then brew a batch, following instructions included with the beer kit you buy separately.

Home brewing is relatively easy, with the most critical things to watch being sanitation and fermentation and aging temperature. Be sure to sanitize with the included sanitizer, and make sure that if you have liquid yeast included with your kit that it is active and rises to at least 1½" thick before using.

Needed But Not Included:

1. Five Gallon Extract Brewing Kit, see williamsbrewing.com.
2. Seven Gallon or larger boiling pot, conventional or electric (Mash & Boil, Digiboil)
3. Wort Chiller (not needed but highly recommended)
